Course pre-requisites:-

B level referees accreditation or equivalent

Two successful B level assessments

No restriction on repeating the course

To obtain the A level referees accreditation, participants who have successfully completed this course must pass three assessments at official matches between players of A ranking or higher. At least two of these assessments must be carried out by an assessor other than the presenter of this course.

The A level referees accreditation is valid for 2 years, and may be renewed with one further assessment plus evidence of regular refereeing activity at a suitable level.
